The ACE Workshop Facilitator & Case Manager, Youth Programs reports to the Program Manager. This role is responsible for facilitation of the ACE Workshop portion of the Youth Programs and Case Management. This position is responsible for a wide range of activities to include but are not limited to:

- Providing engaged enrollment- making phone calls, ensuring participants complete intake process, and scheduling program assessments.
- Responsible for STRIVE ACE Workshop facilitation and curriculum delivery for youth ages 16-24 with an emphasis on youth development, which includes: future outlook training, professional skill development, work readiness and youth development based groups as needed.



- Maintaining an interactive training environment that maximizes participation and active learning.
- Maintaining the structure of the classroom in workshops enforcing classroom expectations and accountability.
- Providing transportation to participants as needed to various appointments, community meetings and chaperone participants at program related events or field trips.
- Other duties as assigned.

What Skills Do You Need?

This is challenging work. A positive "can do" spirit is a must. Skills for this specific role include:

- Work collaboratively as part of a team including treatment staff, law enforcement, and court representatives.
- Organized and ability to manage time and priorities.
- Compassionate with the ability to be sensitive to cultural differences or behavior in a multicultural community and various cultural and ethnic groups in a tactful, professional, and effective manner.
- Excellent interpersonal communication, listening, counseling and facilitation skills.
- Solution focused with the ability to identify and resolve problems in a timely manner.
- Ability to work with a high degree of autonomy and exercise responsible judgment.
- Must be able to speak, read, and write in English. Bilingual in English and Spanish languages preferred.
- Ability to be resourceful and flexible in an ever-changing environment.
- Must be computer literate (proficient in Microsoft Word, Excel, Outlook, and Data Management Systems).
- Familiar with the program population.

- Minimum one (1) year experience working in group facilitation and outreach, or related experience required.
- Experience working with justice involved youth and adults preferred.
